Since its inception, IHRC-RFT has responded to several disasters and served hundreds of thousands of victims in various affected communities. Very soon, the organization's scope of operations is being expanded beyond disaster relief to several sustainable human development projects and initiatives around the world, especially volunteering activities for education, women empowerment and youth development around the world.

IHRC-RFT is registered in number of countries and expanding gradually across 5 continents. Its operations are primarily funded by grass root donations from individuals, corporate support, and various other grants. Dedicated volunteers of International Human Rights Commission, the parent organization, is the force multiplier behind the good work that IHRC-RFT delivers, who bring their professional experience to the benefit of the affected communities. It also leverages preferential rates for relief equipment, logistics, and other needed supplies benefiting from global sourcing.

This quadrennial report provides a summary of our achievement of the strategic plan over this four-year quadrennial. It has been a real pleasure to consolidate this information as our achievements have been many. We can justifiably be proud of what has been accomplished over the course of the last four years. While there is, of course, much more that still needs to be done, we can be proud of what we have achieved so far and the foundation that has been laid for our future work.

OUR BACKGROUND:

International Human Rights Commission Relief Fund Trust (IHRC-RFT) first started as a registered charity in 2009 but its informal charitable activities and operations were being done from the platform of International Human Rights Commission. The relief operations carried out so far were not limited to geographical boundaries. Either it was Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Iran, Turkey, or any other disaster affected area Our Rescue teams remained clinging to the issue until resolved. Since its inception, IHRC-RFT has responded to several disasters and served hundreds of thousands of victims in various affected communities. Very soon, the organization's scope of operations is being expanded beyond disaster relief to several sustainable human development projects and initiatives around the world.

This is accomplished through conferences, grants and fellowships, the publication of The Journal "Human Rights Watch", and the IHRC Newsletter, which contains a United Nations column. The organization also collaborates with other organizations, domestically and internationally, by providing volunteers, experts, speakers and working programmes.

Since being granted special consultative status with the Economic and Social Council, the organization's international membership has more than tripled in Africa, Asia, Europe and South America, adding members from previously unrepresented countries. In December 2023, the international membership stood at 2180 persons from 70 countries, with international representation on the organization's governing council. The organization offers the opportunity for free membership to Scholars/ Singers/Artists in developing nations. There has been no substantial change in the sources of the Organization's funding in the past four years, although income has increased.

RELIEF POLICY PARAMETERS

• The People to Serve

Only registered displaced people will be served in camps only.

- Donation Management Policy
 - Relief Goods received will be strictly accountable and proper record of receive and distribution will be maintained.
 - Fund Received from Donors will be deposited and maintained in IHRC Relief Fund Account and hiring experts.
 - Proper audit of account will be arranged and managed periodically and regularly
 - Maximum operational assignments will be run through volunteers (male, Female) but unavoidable expenses will be born through Relief Fund Account.
 - Volunteers of following categories will be called:
 - The volunteers operating with IHRC will be properly registered and record maintained.
 - Forces/ National or International Administration will be requested to extend Security, Vigilance, Supervisory and Coordination service at each end for the relief operation through appointing Liaison Officer.

2020
